

THOUGHTS FROM PASTOR

God's House is where couples are joined in marriage and begin their journey through life as husband and wife.

God's House is where people experience community with God and one another, through Jesus Christ, and grow up and mature in the faith.

God's House is where those who have died in the Faith are remembered and their lives are celebrated in funeral and memorial services, and those who mourn receive comfort and consolation through Jesus who conquered death for us and for our salvation.

OUR HISTORY

For almost 30 years here at Epiphany, in God's House, lives have been changed, renewed, and transformed. God's House is precious to God's children and the Renew initiative is about God. His House, and His people. It is celebrating where we've been and where we are going as God's forgiven, empowered, and victorious children. It is about our personal journeys of faith and our future as a church.

Early 1980s

Ascension Lutheran Church in Houston, Texas gave the Texas District of the Lutheran Church-Missouri Synod (LCMS) \$130,000 to start a mission congregation in Pearland, Texas.



1990

The Pearland Mission rented space for worship and ministry in a shopping center. On Palm Sunday 1990, the first Sunday morning worship service was held. Later that year, on Reformation Sunday, October 27, 1990, Epiphany Lutheran Church, with 113 baptized members, was officially chartered as a member congregation of the Lutheran Church-Missouri Synod.

1989

The Texas District of the LCMS called a seminary graduate (Jon Salminen from St. John's, Michigan) to be mission developer for the Pearland Mission. That same vear, the Pearland mission began as a handful of people meeting for Bible Study in the club house of the Silver Maples Apartment complex.

1991

Epiphany installed the Rev. Jon Salminen as its first pastor. A new sanctuary, classrooms and office space were dedicated on June 4, 1994 in what is now our current location.



1995

Installation of a second called staff member due to substantial growth.

2000

The Ascension Family Life Center, a 20,000 square foot facility with classrooms, a kitchen and a gymnasium was dedicated.



2005

Assisted Rev. Vijay Gurrala in planting Our Redeemer Church to serve the Indian community in southwest Houston.



Installation of a third called staff member to meet the needs of our growing congregation.

2015

Epiphany celebrated 25 years as a congregation of the Lutheran Church-Missouri Synod.



Today

Epiphany is a congregation of 984 baptized members. We have two Sunday morning worship services. Both services are live streamed every week.

RENEW A PASSION IN GOD'S PEOPLE.

To honor God by caring for His House and making changes that will enhance the worship experience of those who meet there. This will include improving our worship space as well as audio and visual technology to better proclaim the Gospel of Jesus Christ.








RENEW A DESIRE FOR GROWTH.

RENEW OUR COMMITMENT TO EMBRACE THE FUTURE.

What we do for the Lord has eternal significance! The mission of Epiphany for the past 30 years has been to "Shine the Light of God's Love on All People." May our Lord Renew the fire He has placed in our hearts so that "Shining the Light of God's Love on All People" is what will shape our future and be the legacy we leave.





PRIMARY GOAL

In order for this Renew Vision to become a reality, we will need 100% engagement of everyone who calls Epiphany their church home to go on a journey of discipleship as it relates to their stewardship and generosity. We want everyone to experience the joy of partnering with God in His mission for this world.

SECONDARY GOAL

Our financial goal of at least \$1.7 million over the next three years will enable us to renew God's House to provide for much needed repairs as well as create a welcoming space for those who worship our Lord, and for those who have yet to have a relationship with Jesus.



OUR PLAN

The funds received through Renew Initiative will be used to (in order of importance).

- Renew the sanctuary to restore the beauty and reverence of God's dwelling place as well as improve lighting, audio and streaming capabilities to reach those who cannot attend in person or those who choose to visit us first online. Current estimated cost is \$2.3 2.4 million, including funds expended or committed to date of \$0.3 million.
- Renew and expand the narthex and restroom facilities to provide a welcoming environment that minimizes distraction of members and visitors as they attend worship. Current estimated cost is \$0.65 0.75 million.
- Enhance the Ascension Family Life Center (AFLC) downstairs restrooms with showers to add capabilities for serving our congregation and community in times of need. Current estimated cost is \$0.25 0.3 million.





JOURNEY OF A GIVER

The Journey of a Giver focuses on behaviors and attitudes of our hearts rather than on amounts or percentages, further transforming us into the likeness of Christ. Each step of the journey represents growth in a lifestyle of generosity and sacrifice



INITIAL GIVER



Decides to give for the first time, out of a response to God's Word. This is someone who wants to give something and trust God and the leaders of the Church with this gift.

CONSISTENT GIVER



Commits to give something consistently to exercise the discipline of giving regularly. Often, someone who makes their gift an online recurring gift will learn the behavior of consistency.

INTENTIONAL GIVER



Determines their giving in relation to other things on which they spend their money. For example, this type of giver begins asking the question, "Why am I giving more to Verizon than I am giving to God? Should I be giving to God more than I give for my mortgage each month?" This giver starts to make their giving an intentional choice that reflects how they prioritize and spend their money.

SURRENDERED GIVER



Recognizes the cost Christ paid on the cross for us and is surrendered to honoring God with 100% of their resources as a result. They give in a way that changes them. Their giving determines their spending/saving rather than their spending/saving determining their giving. They are not concerned with what they ARE giving but more concerned with what they're NOT giving and why.

LIFETIME GIVER



Thinks about the long-term effects of generosity rather than month-to-month generosity or even year-to-year. Their giving goal governs their short and long term purchasing decisions such as homes, cars, investments, vacations, etc, in order to allow for their generosity capacity to be realized.

NEXT STEPS

PRAY


Pray boldly that God will multiply our efforts to awaken the Epiphany community to Jesus. Pray that He will make clear the next step He is asking each of us to take in our discipleship journey.

COMMIT

Commit fully to reach our goal of 100% engagement. Stand firm with your church family at Epiphany, committing to do what God asks of you.

GIVE

Give expectantly, in a way that stretches you to a deeper level of generosity. Give knowing that God will do a powerful work in you to further His kingdom here on earth.



FAQS

How do I participate in the Renew Initiative? We want all members to prayerfully consider what God has done in their lives and the impact Epiphany has had in their discipleship journey. Then, on May 21st, we ask you to commit to giving over and above your current financial support for a three year period, from June 2023 to May 2026.
